



FAQs for Remote Instruction

NOTE: during the 2021-22 school year, the use of remote instruction is largely limited to students in extended COVID-related quarantines.

1. What if my child is absent for a Non-COVID related reason? (i.e. vacation, dental appointment, etc.) Will my child live stream with their teacher(s)?

➤ *NO, your child will not live stream into class. They will not be issued a device (students in grade 4 or lower). They will catch up on missed assignments when they return to school. This will count as a regular absence.*

2. What if my child is ill and has a pending COVID test? Will they live stream with their teacher?

➤ *NO, if your child is getting tested, they may be back in a day or two. (pending negative test) They DO NOT need to live stream into class . They will not be issued a device (students in grade 4 or lower). They will catch up on missed assignments when they return to school.*

3. What if my child tests positive or is being quarantined for a set period of time due to close contact exposure/or is living with a family member who is positive?

➤ *If your child tests positive for COVID, or is a close contact and is quarantining for a definite period of time, age appropriate asynchronous learning activities and live stream opportunities will be communicated by individual teachers. Also, students in grades K-4 will be issued a district device to use. (grade 5-12 students already have devices)*

4. Can my child start live streaming immediately after being told to quarantine?

➤ *The teachers/school will need some time to: (1) Gather student materials (2) Update Google Classroom Assignments (3) Issue chromebooks and (4) Provide time for families to pick materials up. The goal is to get students learning asap! Thank you for your patience! The classroom teachers will reach out with specific information.*

5. Who should I contact to find out what time my child should log on?

- *Your child's homeroom teacher will communicate the specific times to live stream into the classroom. Again, we ask for your patience, as the teachers have both in person learning and live stream learning happening at once.*

6. What if my child has an extended absence due to illness, surgery, etc.?

- *In this case, your child may be eligible for homebound instruction for up to ten hours per week; if possible, this is provided by in-person tutors who may meet with your child in your home. Medical documentation would be submitted to your child's principal for review by the district physician to determine eligibility for homebound services for the duration designated by your child's doctor.
